Concrete measures by Member States



- Multiannual workplan under the EU Agenda for Tourism 2030 with several actions
 - 25 MS reported on their actions through the Tourism Advisory Committee (TAC)
 - <u>Best practices document</u> on concrete actions by MS
- National public administrations from 11 MS submitted **pledges**
 - mainly on data/measurements & comprehensive strategies
- Updated **strategies/action plans** in 10 MS (since 2022)
 - including economic, environmental and social sustainability
- Well-being of **residents** considered a priority in 17 MS
 - followed by digitalisation for data-driven destination management, diversification of tourism services, reducing environmental impact of tourism services
- Accessibility is the most commonly reported measure (14 MS)
 - followed by awareness raising, data and measurements, collaborative destination governance



Concrete measures by stakeholders


- Continuous **collection of pledges** demonstrates engagement across all groups of actors and all topics
 - Over 500 pledges (summer 2024)
 - Pledges coming most often from SMEs (16%), business associations (13%), and DMOs (13%)
- Key achievement: Establishment of the **T4T Expert Group**
 - 3 subgroups: Green transition, Digital transition, Skills Resilience and Inclusion
 - Each subgroup will quarterly lead a topic (constraints, challenges, legislative gaps, etc.) for debate and produce recommendations, reports or conclusions on that subject.
 - Act as a bridge between broader stakeholder community and the Commission
 - Facilitate pledges implementation
 - Support Pathway and EU Agenda 2030 monitoring (stocktaking report...)
 - Community support through Stakeholder Support Platform (content + monthly focus topics)



First stock-taking exercise has built a basis for annual follow-up, contributing to 3-yearly reporting to the Council on EU Agenda 2030 Main Priorities and challenges

- Same as the TTP, this was a co-creation process with inputs from the ecosystem
- Need for more awareness raising on the Pathway especially at local/SME level
 - \rightarrow Motivate SMEs to engage in the transition why useful and what to do?
 - \rightarrow Collect more pledges (all MS, different organisation types)
- Need for specific efforts on skills and digitalisation
- Data and indicators are a key need recognised by all (to analyse, make decisions and follow progress) with several dispersed efforts
- Some issues have gained in importance (climate change, energy efficiency, overtourism...) and could merit new dedicated topics
- Continue Work with T4T expert subgroups, develop more the EU Tourism Dashboard, revision of EU Tourism statistics Regulation...





T4T Expert Group (June 2023 onwards, 3-yearly period)



Who: +/-50 experts selected through open call representing private and third-sector tourism organisations + 25 nominated representatives of public authorities – all across EU

Objective: Act as a bridge between broader stakeholder community and the European Commission

- Support monitoring of Transition Pathway and EU Agenda for Tourism 2030 (contributing to stocktaking report with information on stakeholder actions and achievements)
- Governance of the T4T online community platform (strategic principles for priorities and activities, content and activity follow-up)
- **T4T online community engagement design**: Designing monthly focus topics to be implemented by the contractor with webinars, online discussion, focused knowledge articles

European Commission

• Support preparation (advice), follow-up (progress analysis) and visibility (through platform, events) of pledges and their results

Plans for 2024: Stakeholder Support Platform

- More user-friendly pledge submission and progress follow-up
- Increased visibility and information sharing news, articles, activities, tailored recommendations and searches
- Monthly focus topics prepared by the T4T expert subgroups (webinars, topic-focused articles, goaloriented discussions with end summary)

This is a communitytool, a one-stop-shop where you can find relevant information regarding your main interest subjects (that you can change and adapt and update at all times) and where you can see EU level information, but also national or regional level, policies, strategies, legislation, funding, calendar, networking, and where you will submit your future pledges that can be displayed, sharing your best practices and promoting a better more sustainable and more resilient Ecosystem

I3 Instrument: Capacity Building Strand 2b

- The Interregional Innovation Investments Instrument (I3) creates **linkages for interregional collaboration** bringing together actors from different EU regions investing in joint innovation projects along S3 priorities and close to the market.
- The present call aims to test new approaches for increasing the capacity of regional innovation ecosystems in **less developed regions** to collaborate in EU value chains.
- As output, Strand 2b projects refer to the concrete experimentation of new approaches, solutions and good practices to engage in interregional innovation processes mobilising ecosystems and in particular SMEs.
 Projects are expected to deliver a pipeline of potential interregional investments as well as business and investment plans.

I3 Instrument: Strand 1 and 2a

- The European Commission has launched a call for proposals under the Interregional Innovation Investments (I3) Instrument, funded by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), to **support interregional innovation** and the development of EU value chains.
- This call aims to promote **innovation, diffusion, and reinforcement of value chains** through cooperation based on shared priorities and complementary capabilities. The 2024 call is organized into two strands:
 - Strand 1: Offers financial and advisory support for investments in interregional innovation projects in shared or complementary smart specialisation areas. It targets consortia of innovation actors from regions with varying levels of development and innovation performance.
 - Strand 2a: Provides financial and advisory support for interregional innovation projects focusing on developing value chains in less developed regions, enhancing their integration into EU value chains.
